From Our Pastor -

The last two years for me has reinforced one thing I have maintained for a long time: humans are social beings. We do best when we are in community, when we are connected. We are relational, social beings.

Sadly, experts are seeing how we are now more isolated and disconnected than ever. Polls keep showing how we now have fewer friends than ever, and that we live farther from family than ever. More of us are disconnected from families and friends through broken relationships, neglect, dysfunction, divorce, and other causes.

What seems more than coincidental to me is the drop in church membership, attendance, and participation at the same time as

the increase in loneliness and isolation. Being part of a faith community is one crucial way we can stay connected to one another, to invest in the lives of others, and to be healthy social beings. To be the Church of Jesus Christ means that we intentionally choose to be in community with one another. That is a vital and healthy thing.

Do you know someone who may feel disconnected? Isolated? Lonely? Who do you know that might be longing to be connected, to be in community with people who can invest in them? Who can you invite to be part of a healthy and health-giving Christian community like Mohawk Church?

There is no better time than today to ask someone you know who is lonely or disconnected to join you in worship. In John 10:10, Jesus says, "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." Let's help others have that full and health-giving life in connection with Him and with one another.
